

EOC – EXAM – EXEMPTIONS

INFORMATION

Courses with an EOC

In courses with an EOC, the first and second nine-week averages will be determined by counting each nine-week period grade as 42.5% with the End of Course exam counting the remaining 15%.

1st 9-Weeks 42.5%

2nd 9-Weeks 42.5%

EOC Exam 15.0%

Courses without an EOC

In courses without an EOC, the first and second nine-week averages will be determined by counting each nine-week period as 42.5% and a final semester exam counting for the remaining 15%.

1st 9-Weeks 42.5%

2nd 9-Weeks 42.5%

Final Exam 15.0%

In the event of test modifications or cancellations by the State of Tennessee, EOC subject grades will be calculated by averaging the first and second nine-week grades at 50% each.

Thursday, December 16 is a full day of school, and we will have 1st and 2nd block exams on that day with the remainder of the day devoted to exam prep/project prep. You may schedule CT exams to fit the time you need for the completion of the exam. We will meet CT on 12/16, but if you need to begin your CT exam on Wednesday, Dec 15 for students to have time to complete the exam you may.

Friday, December 17 is a half-day of school, and we will use the following schedule:

8:00-9:25 3rd block exams given

9:25-9:32 Break

9:33-11:00 4th block exams

11:00 Dismissal

Any student who misses their exam must be present on January 4, 2022 to make up the exam with you. Any student who misses an EOC will carry an incomplete until such time in the Spring semester that they can sit for the EOC.

Below is the Exemption Policy. Remember a student coded with 6's is not considered as absent thus those days would not count against exemptions. **For those giving an end-of-unit project/test (EOC classes), this is considered a normal grade and not subject to an exemption. It may be completed on December 15, thus students would not be required to be in attendance on the exam day.**

Students may qualify to be exempt from taking a final exam (not End of Course Tests) in a class if he or she meets the criteria below. A teacher may require a student to take the final exam if the teacher feels it is in the academic interest of the student. The term "absence" for exemptions is any absence as defined under attendance.

A-average and no more than 3 absences

B-average and no more than 2 absences

C-average and no more than 1 absence

Students may not have a combination of more than 5 tardies. Students may not have any ISS or OSS. No student will be allowed to be exempt from a Final Exam if they have any zeros reflected in their grade profile.

ATTENDANCE

Wednesday, December 15, is the last regular day for taking Attendance.

EXEMPTION DISMISSALS

If you are Exempt from an exam and will be checking out at some point during the day on Monday, Dec. 12, Tuesday, Dec. 13, or Wednesday, Dec. 13, due to this...you must bring a parent note to sign-in or out through the front office. PHONE CALLS AND TEXTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED.

EXAM DAY DISMISSALS

On Exam days, Thursday, Dec. 16, and Friday, Dec. 17, you will sign out with your teacher and leave a parent note with your teacher. PHONE CALLS AND TEXTS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED
